- U19 Men’s & Women’s between the Age of 17 and 18 according to their year of birth (2007 & 2008).
U19 Men’s Weight Categories - 47-50Kg, 55Kg, 60Kg, 65Kg, 70Kg, 75Kg, 80Kg, 85Kg, 90Kg, +90Kg.
U19 Women’s Weight Categories - 45-48Kg, 51Kg, 54Kg, 57Kg, 60Kg, 65Kg, 70Kg, 75Kg, 80Kg, +80Kg
- U22 Men’s & Women’s between the Age of 19 and 21 according to their year of birth (2004 - 2006).
U22 Men’s Weight Categories - 47-50Kg, 55Kg, 60Kg, 65Kg, 70Kg, 75Kg, 80Kg, 85Kg, 90Kg, +90Kg.
U22 Women’s Weight Categories - 45-48Kg, 51Kg, 54Kg, 57Kg, 60Kg, 65Kg, 70Kg, 75Kg, 80Kg, +80Kg
- Reserve Boxers: If your National Federation is hesitating between two boxers, or simply wants to prevent any injury, please use the “Reserve Boxer” function in the database. This function will allow you to register more than one boxer in the same category, and you can choose last minute which boxer will participate even after registration ends (only one boxer will be allowed to compete in each category).

8. COMPETITION SYSTEM

- The Championships will be conducted according to current World Boxing Technical Rules.
- The Official Draw will be conducted by Swiss Timing system operated by Asian Boxing officials through an electronic draw.
- The Scoring System will be based on a “Ten Point Must System”.
- There will be five (5) Judges for each bout in accordance with the electronic draw Scoring System.

10. Boxing Entries Check

The Boxing Entries check is the final part of the event entry process. Asian Boxing and the LOC will inform Teams of their exact appointment time prior to the event as well as it will be displayed on the Team information board. The Boxing Entries Check is mandatory for all Teams, and teams should make all necessary arrangements to arrive timely for their respective appointment. Each Team may appoint a maximum of two people to attend its Boxing Entries Check (e.g. Team Leader and the Team Doctor).

10.1 In order to be cleared for the competition, Teams must provide the following documents for each boxer, signed and completed as required:

- Copy of passport
- Record Book (with annual medical examination completed within the previous 12 months)
- Medical Certificate issued within the previous three months, signed by the National Federation doctor
- Declaration of Non-Pregnancy Form (women boxers only), signed by the boxer/legal guardian
- Uniforms (red and blue) per World Boxing Competition Rules
- IMAGES & VIDEOS RIGHTS CONSENT FORM (Team Manager must sign on behalf of all team members)
- Results of Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and HIV tests, not older than 6 months. (Mandatory)

10.2 Each team Delegation must also bring the following:

- National Flag 1X1.5 m
- National Anthem on USB Drive/ CD in mp3 format

10.3 Boxer's Uniform:

- The vest and shorts/skirt can be in the Boxer's respective national colours or in red or blue colour according to the Boxer's respective corner allocation
- Women Boxers may wear a black sport form-fitting Hijab
- The belt line of any shorts/ skirts must be clearly indicated by contrasting colours and by using a 6.10cm wide elastic waistband (The belt line is an imaginary line from the navel to the top of the hips)
- Bring a Hair net/ bandanna (for boxers with long hair)

10.4 Official boxing equipment

All official boxing equipment for the championship will be provided by Asian Boxing.

11. MEDALS

Asian Boxing and the local organizing committee will provide all medal

1st Place	Gold Medal (1)
2nd Place	Silver Medal (1)
3rd Place	Bronze Medal (1)

12. ACCREDITATION

For Team Delegations

All delegation members who have registered for the Asian Boxing U19 & U22 Boxing Championship – Bangkok 2025 through the official Asian Boxing Registration Form by July 5, 2025, will receive their accreditation upon payment of the accommodation fees to the Local Organizing Committee (LOC).

13. INSURANCE

All accredited participants must have their own travel, medical, repatriation, and liability insurance covering the entire event and travel period.

14. MEDICAL SERVICES

The LOC will provide first aid during the entire event period to any participant who suffers from a sports injury contracted during the event.

15. ANTI-DOPING

Doping control will be conducted in accordance with World Boxing Anti-Doping Rules and World Anti-Doping Code. According to WADA regulations, blood testing may be conducted during World Boxing Competitions.

16. IMAGE RIGHTS & VIDEO RECORDING

The LOC will film the event for broadcast and promotional videos, and official event photographers will take still images of boxers before and during the event. All training sessions will be open to the accredited media unless a Team specifically requests otherwise. By participating in the event, each Team Member agrees to release his/her image rights to Asian Boxing and the LOC. Video recording of bouts for broadcasting purposes of any kind (including media) will not be allowed. National Federations may be allowed to record bouts of their boxers using only one camera per ring, exclusively for technical purposes. Specific locations in the venue will be reserved for this purpose. Each National Federation must submit a signed copy of the Video Recording Disclaimer at the Technical Meeting to Asian Boxing Competition Manager.
